He was named *TRACE*, and fostered by the kind man who found him. The folks there raised more than \$400 to help cover the \$800 vet bill. He was also neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped. 
caregivers there, he overcame his fear of humans, was socialized and transferred to a No-Kill Rescue in CO, where he would be adopted into a loving family.





### **TOTALS FOR BOTH RESCUES 2024**




